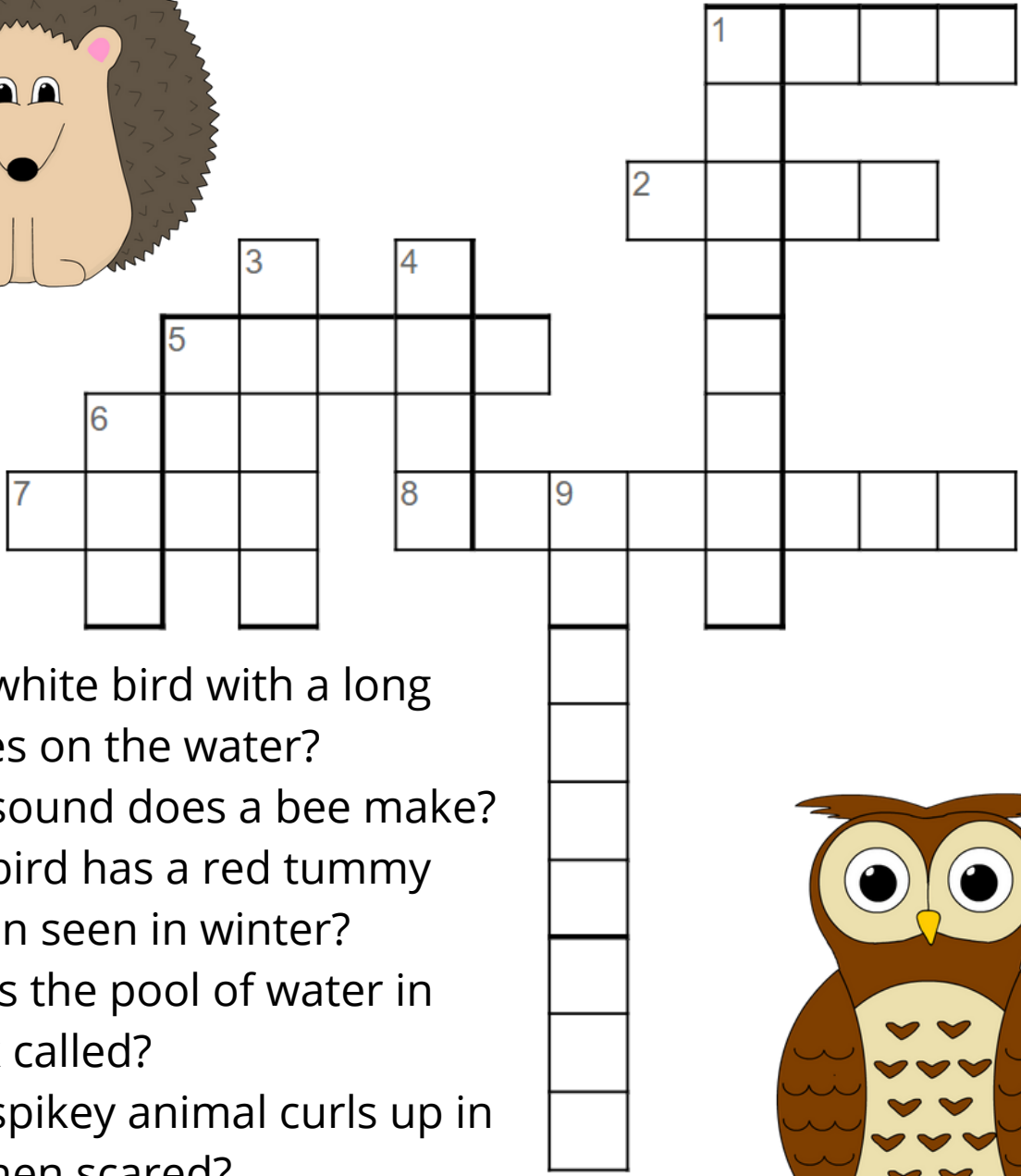
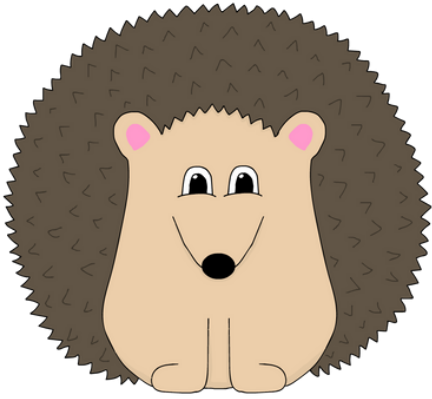


I've lost my acorn! Could you please help me find it by following this maze?

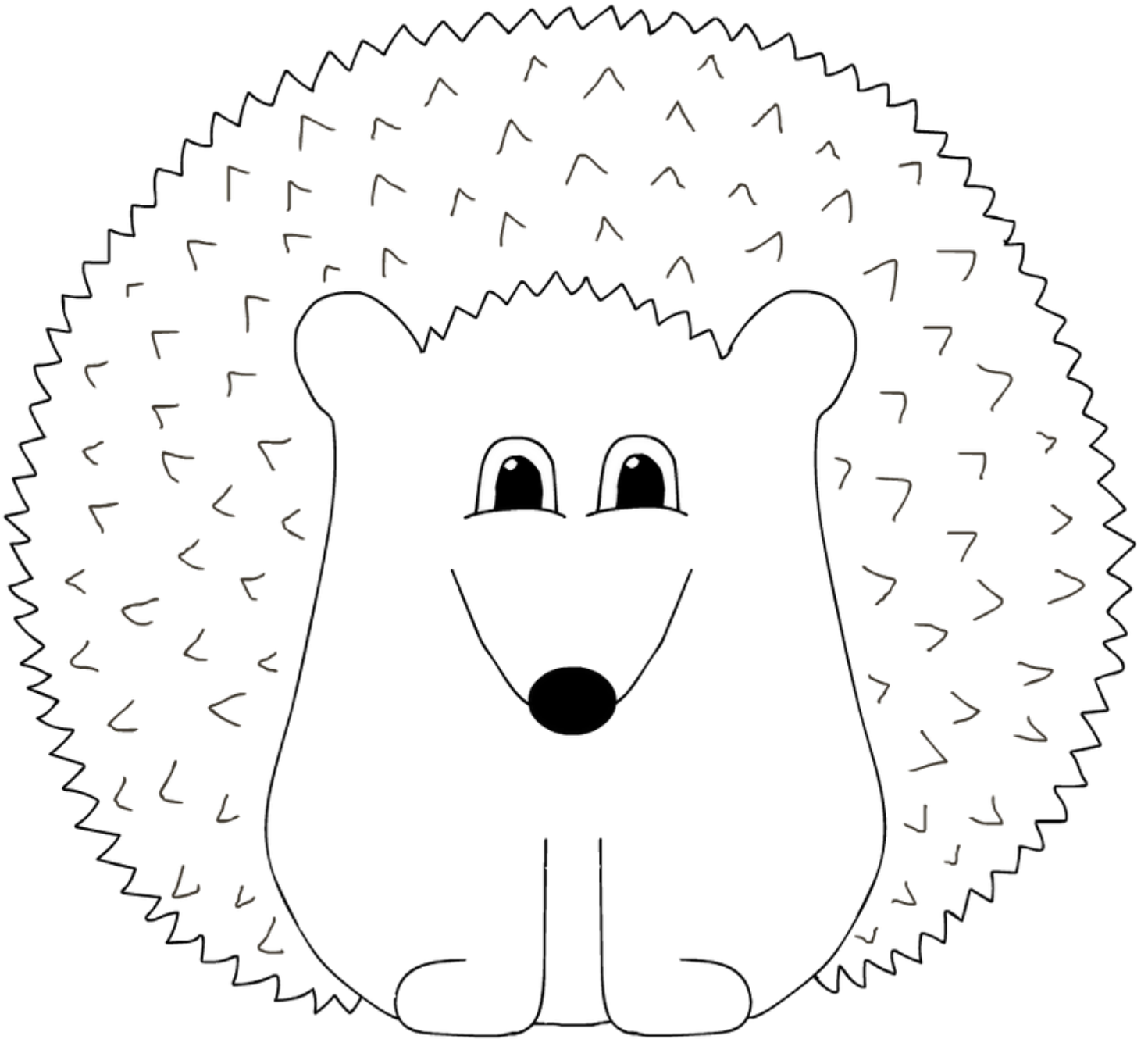

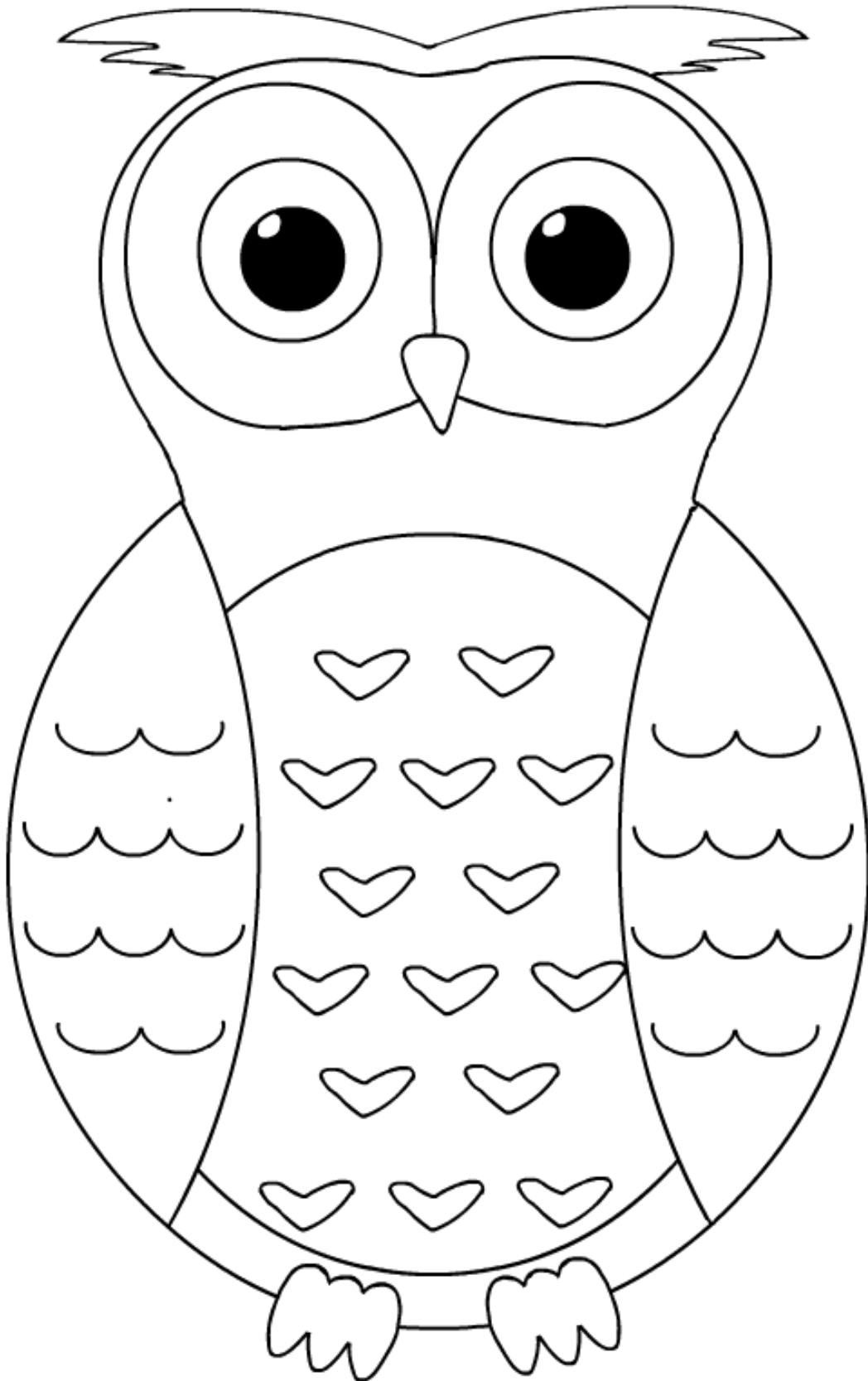

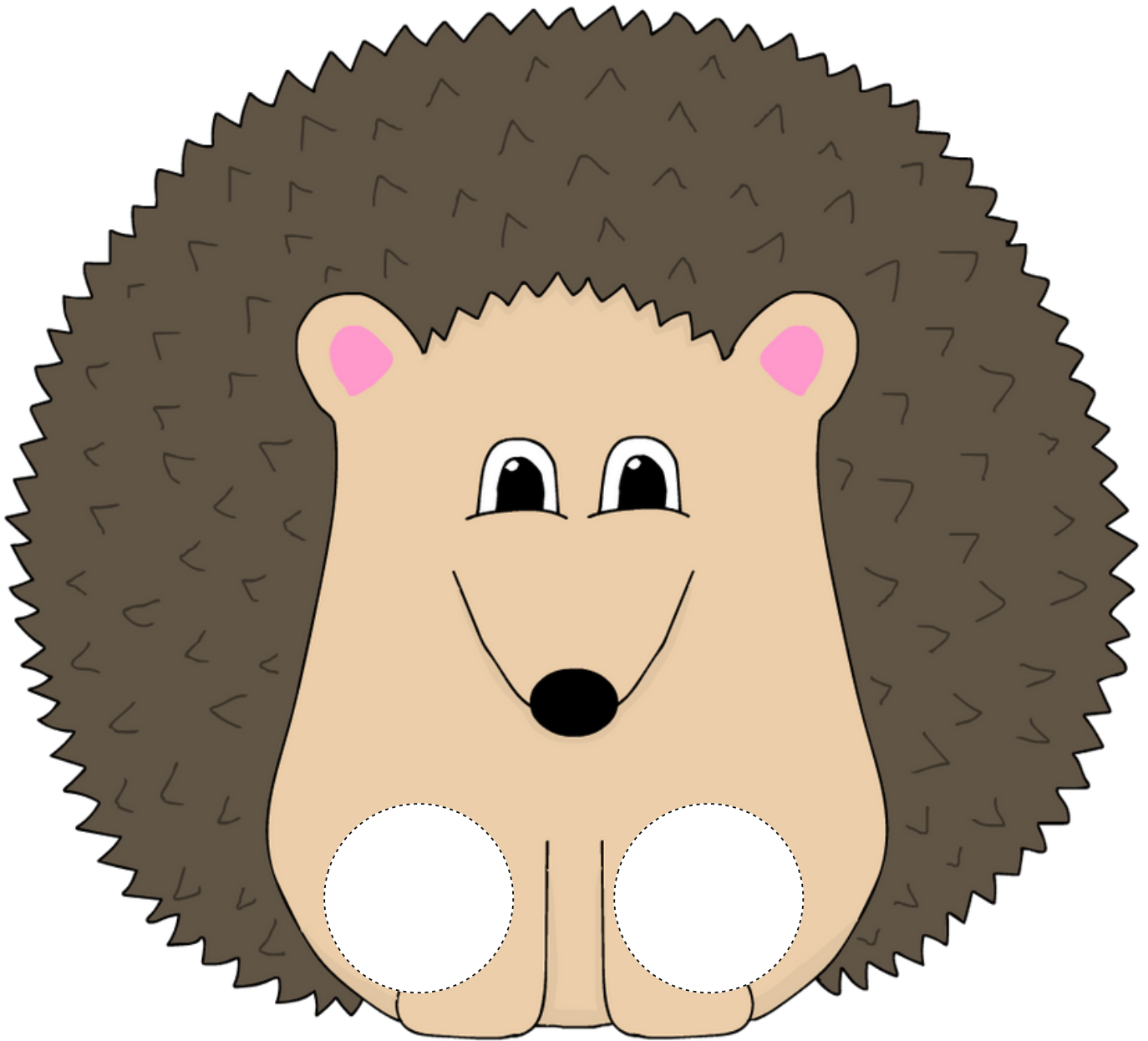

How to Make a Pinecone Bird Feeder

You will need:

- A Pinecone
- A piece of string
- Wild Bird Seed
- Lard



1. Mix together your bird seed and lard until it forms a mouldable mixture
2. Pack it into the pine cone, pushing it into the cracks until its covered
3. Using the gaps in the pinecone, tie the string around one end and tie a knot so it can be hung in your garden.





How to make a Nature Garland



You will need:

- A piece of string
- Different nature items like leaves, pinecones, flowers or berries.

1. Tie or thread your different items onto the piece of string until you are happy with your finished garland
2. Hang it outside and enjoy your beautiful creation!





How to Make an Apple Bird Feeder

You will need:

- Sunflower Seeds
- 2 short twigs
- 1 long twig
- A piece of string
- An Apple
- An Apple Corer



1. Using the apple corer, core the apple (ask an adult to help with this).
2. Push the sunflower seeds into the apple until it is covered in spikey seeds.
3. Push the two small twigs into either side of the apple.
4. Tie the long stick in the middle of the string.
5. Thread the string through the middle of the apple so the stick sits at the bottom.
6. Tie off and hang outside.
